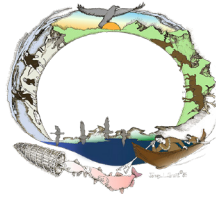

Our Mission

Tanana Chiefs Conference provides a unified voice in advancing sovereign tribal governments through the promotion of physical and mental wellness, education, socioeconomic development, and culture of the Interior Alaska Native people.

Our Purpose

The purpose of the TCC Adult Vocational Training (AVT) program is to provide financial assistance to eligible tribal members enrolled to an accredited university or institution.

This funding is supplemental – applicants are required to apply for all available state, federal and private financial aid while also utilizing all available personal and family resources.

AVT funding covers certificate programs (less than two years) and Associate of Applied Science Degrees (two year AAS).

Application Deadlines

- April 30 Academic year
- November 15 Spring deadline
- March 15 Summer deadline

It is the student's responsibility to contact the TCC Education & Indigenous Learning program to ensure his/her file is complete and submitted or postmarked by the appropriate deadline. Applications need original signature. TCC does not accept faxed applications.

Eligibility

TCC provides higher education and adult vocational training funding consideration (regardless of residency) to tribal members enrolled to Birch Creek, Huslia, Minto or Tetlin.

For members of other tribes, applicants must be:

- enrolled in a federally recognized tribe, or are an at-Large Shareholder of Doyon Limited (Class B), **and**
- are currently residing in Fairbanks.

Applicant must provide verification of enrollment or a copy of their BIA Certificate of Indian Blood Card (CIBC), or proof of "At-Large" (Class B) membership in Doyon.

Eligibility shall be determined by Education & Indigenous Learning program staff.
