Disability Employment Services

Services for enrolled Tribal members aged 18 to 64 years in all subregions who have trouble getting or keeping a job or being productive in subsistence activities.

Serving People Who Experience Permanent Disabilities, Including:

- Recently graduated students in special education • Veterans • Learning disabilities
- Amputation • Diabetes • Head injuries • Hearing impairments • Mental Illness
- Orthopedic problems • Seizure disorders • Speech problems • Spinal problems
- Visual impairments • Intellectual development disabilities • Alcohol & Substance Use Recovery

Services Provided for Employment Outcomes:

- Intake/initial assessment • Individual employment counseling & guidance/case management • Assistance for subsistence, self-employment, competitive jobs
- On-the-job training, tutoring, mentoring • Licenses, equipment, supplies & tools
- *REFERRALS for independent living services, recreational opportunities, suitable job placement, assistive devices such as artificial limbs, hearing aids, wheelchairs, medical & psychiatric services, etc. as funds are available.*

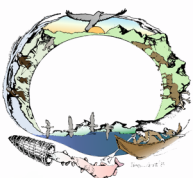
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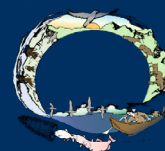
What It Does vs. What It Does *Not* Do

✓ What TVR Does:

- Helps individuals with disabilities prepare for, obtain, and maintain employment
- Provides vocational assessments and individualized employment planning
- Offers job readiness training, coaching, and employment counseling
- Supports certifications and skill-building tied to employment goals
- Assists with tools, equipment, clothing, or supplies needed for a job
- Coordinates referrals for medical, psychological, or independent living services
- Supports subsistence-based and self-employment goals when appropriate
- Provides short-term, disability-related assistance necessary for employment
- Works collaboratively with Tribal, state, and community partners
- May cover short-term education costs only if no other funding is available and must be tied to employment

✗ What TVR Does *Not* Do:

- Does **not** provide long-term financial assistance or income support
- Does **not** pay for personal bills, rent, utilities, or general living expenses
- Does **not** provide medical treatment, diagnosis, or long-term therapy
- Does **not** guarantee a job or override employer hiring requirements
- Does **not** fund items or services unrelated to an employment plan
- Does **not** replace SSI/SSDI, TANF, or other benefit programs
- Does **not** provide emergency services (housing, crisis care, transportation)
- Does **not** serve individuals who do not meet eligibility requirements
- Does **not** offer unlimited funding - services must be tied to employment needs



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
